1 Specialized transportation services

3 Public transportation

Depending on your county, you can choose between buses, trains, or paratransit options.

4 Free or low-cost vouchers

These transportation vouchers are great options for older people and individuals with disabilities who have low incomes or are otherwise unable to use public transit.
